Subj: Monthly Report

During the month of October, 2011 the Fire Department responded to a total of 158 alarms for service. There were 107 calls for the Rescue service of those 46 were for Advanced Life Support, 34 for Basic Life Support and 2 for Basic Life support without transportation to a medical facility. In this group there were 13 needless alarms for either accidental alarms or refusal of treatment. During the month there were 20 times that Mutual Aid was called to assist and there were also 10 times that Barrington was called to assist outside communities.

There were 24 alarms for Fire related calls. There were no residential fire and there was 1 outside fires. There were also 23 calls either accidental or fire alarm system malfunctions.

There were 27 alarms classified as Other Alarms that include investigations for smoke, wires and transformers, gas leaks citizen assists.

Non-Emergency activities included Fire Inspections commercial, public and private buildings and smoke and carbon monoxide inspections in residences that are ready for resale. Plan review of construction projects also occur as needed during the month.

Rescue Mutual Aid is closely monitored on a monthly basis and during October, 2011 Barrington requested aid from East Providence 14 times for a twelve month total of 101 calls. Barrington supplied Mutual Aid to East Providence 7 times for a twelve month total of 91 calls.

Rescue billing receipts for the month of October was \$22,406 and for Smoke Detector Inspections and Construction Plan Review the total was \$1390..
